'It Looks Pretty from a Distance'

Short summary

Unfolding in a secluded Polish village by the woods and a river "Z daleka widok jest piekny" (It Looks Pretty from a Distance) is a love story between a scrapper and a girl. In an air of ubiquitous secrecy the villagers and the couple live their usual dull lives of hardship until the scrapper vanishes. His disappearance triggers a chain of unexpected events. In the strikingly beautiful surroundings, under the schorching sun human evil surfaces.

Introduction

There is a paved road leading to the village but it is worn and narrow.

It looks pretty from a distance. Meadows, fields. The village is secluded,

cut off by a river and a forest.

It's been this way for years. The river and forest cut off the village.

There is no bridge on the river and people cross it

pulling a boat along a cable.

The river is clean, a bit overgrown by the banks,

muddy in places, but you can bathe in the summer.

Children in the river.

Two women and three children drowned in the river.

First the women

Threw the children into the river and then jumped -

Out of fear.

The people waited. Crowding on the bank.

Pitchforks stones and knives. Pitchforks stones and knives.

The women were alone.

There are dens and hollows in the forest in which a person could hide.

People can burrow like animals.

When the elders of the vilage were young, they dug up the forest. Scooped out the hollows.

Even today you can still find something if you dig deep enough.

But nothing of value. All these years

and the greed's still there. Pitchforks stones and knives.

People are searching elsewhere.

Summary

A hot summer in a countryside. Everything is falling apart, people live on gathering all sorts of garbage and wastes; scattered, worn out objects cover the farmyards enclosed by wobbly fences. The main character, Pawe , makes his living by collecting ł scrap metal. He lives with his elderly and mentally ill mother that he cannot cope with, thus he drives her away from home. He has a fiancée, they are planning to get married. But one day Paweł suddenly disappears, nobody knows where he is. His neighbours start to steal different things from the desolate house. At the beginning they do it bashfully, in secret, under cover of darkness, later on, they continue completely openly. At one moment the whole community gathers around the house and takes everything that may be of any use. Paweł returns to his home village, but there is nothing to come back to. And because it is most difficult to forgive the wrongs we did to the others, the community will not let Paweł stay.
